UA prof's jazz group flawless on 'Perfect' CD

Jazz lovers — the dyed-in-the-wool as well as the newly minted — are going to love Sylvan Street's debut CD, "The Perfect Leaf."

Released this summer by Summit Records, "The Perfect Leaf" is an eclectic blend of many styles: some original jazz, some rock, a bit of Latin and a topping of funk. The result is a collection of songs that will have you tapping your toes to swinging and funky beats while your soul weeps through the love ballads.

And that's just what Sylvan Street bandleader Jay Rees planned.

Rees, a University of Arizona School of Music professor and associate director of bands, said he and his colleagues made "a conscious effort to do the music we believed in."

A lot of times, he said, record companies will try to keep an album focused on a particular style, and neither he nor the others wanted that.

Rees, known to most Tucsonans as the director of the Pride of Arizona Marching Band, came up with the idea to form the jazz band about a year and a half ago.

"I wondered, what if I could bring together my favorite players?" said Rees, a bass player and composer. "What would it be like to make music with them?"

That was the genesis of Sylvan Street.

He contacted his A-list of favorite musicians around the country — "my musical dream team" — and broached the idea.

It was a go for all:

- Frank Browne on guitar.
- Andrew Hix, drummer and vocalist.
- Kelland Thomas, saxophone.
- Chad Shoopman, trumpet.
- Evan Rees, piano/keyboards.
- Michael Faltin, percussion.

Rees' wife, Wendy, also was involved in the project, co-writing the ballad "Me 'N You" and penning "Millie's," an up-tempo, contemporary jazz song on the album.

Sylvan Street's combined résumés read like a "how can you possibly top this" listing of musical accomplishments and endeavors. They are musicians' musicians, artists who work and produce the best.

Plus, all — except Evan Rees, the 16-year-old son of Jay and Wendy — are music educators.

This was part of Rees' idea — "to put it out there not only as performers, but also as educators. We will be doing master classes and workshops with younger musicians" whenever possible as part of concert appearances.

"Once I put this thing together, I realized that all of them are great teachers. It was a slam-dunk in my

mind — to give back to the next generation."

When Sylvan Street opens the 2009 UA Faculty Artist Series with a concert at Centennial Hall on Thursday, that appearance will cap a day of performance and workshops for high school students.
